

Revs & Rumbles @ the NCM

During the August CCR meeting last year, we introduced a topic that generated a fair number of questions and significant interest. The intention was to make known to the CCR membership that 2024 would be a year of opportunity for participation in one or both celebratory events occurring during August 26-September 1. The focus of the excitement is celebration of the 30th Anniversary of the National Corvette Museum's opening in 1994. Since then, the event has been celebrated at the Museum every five years during the Labor Day weekend. The NCM is located in Bowling Green, KY, approximately 660 miles from Richmond. Most people make the trip in their Corvette and they may travel alone or with others.

And that brings us to the second event.... The National Corvette Caravan is a concurrent happening during which attendees from the U.S. and Canada gather in large numbers to drive their Corvettes to the Museum in designated groups. CCR's assignment will be the 2024 Carolinas, Virginia, & Maryland Caravan. A cursory overview of the route we will drive begins with departure on Mon, Aug 26th, probably from the parking lot across from Colonial Chevrolet in Chester. We will drive to Asheville, N.C., (360 mi, about 6 hrs with 2 bathroom stops) to pickup info packets and then participate in an Evening Meet & Greet with members of other Clubs. Tues, Aug 27th, will also be info packet pickup and Lunch at the Deer Park Inn at the Biltmore Hotel followed by the Caravan kicking off with a drive to Sevierville, TN, (92 mi, about 1 hr 45 min with 1 bathroom stop). We'll stay in the Kodak, TN, area that evening. Wed AM, the 28th, we'll depart for our drive to Bowling Green (234 mi, 4 hrs with at least one bathroom stop). We'll arrive at our hotel, the Hampton Inn, in Bowling Green, KY, and have our evening meal there. The caravan will officially conclude with our arrival but there may be changes.

Registration opened Mar 1st, 2023 (23's correct!) and will close July 1, 2024. The Caravan costs are \$150/person including a T-shirt (except if you're 2X or larger, \$2). **Kim Shelton** is the NC/SC/VA/MD Caravan contact person to whom you'll send your check along with the completed registration form: 3501 Laguna Vista Drive, Waco, Texas 76708. Note: don't ask me why our contact person has a Waco, Texas address!?? The next page is the Registration Form to be completed. Use it or download a copy online.

Note that so far we have discussed timelines, costs, and events associated with the National Corvette Caravan component of the 30th Anniversary Celebration. There are also costs associated with our arrival at the Museum but many of these are elective/optional expenditures that are not mandatory but rather reflect individual tastes. Everyone is charged an entrance fee but there's a monetary advantage to paying the Pre-Registration fee (\$50 for Lifetime Members, \$60 for Members, \$85 for non-members). If one decides to wait for On-Site Registration, the prices rise (\$60 for lifetime members, \$70 for members, \$95 for non-members). All drivers, passengers, and guests participating in the Caravan or Anniversary event MUST sign the event waiver before participating in any portion of the event. ADA parking is always readily available. Shuttle service will be available between the Museum and the Motorsports Park but transportation is not provided from area hotels to the NCM or the MSP.

Also of some importance is that Motorsports Park Touring Laps signup registration is already open NOW. Go online with the various events occurring during the Anniversary Celebration to secure your time to be on the track with your car. Also of great importance to many is having an opportunity to tour the Corvette Vehicle Assembly Plant and times for those tours are already open online for the Bash but securing times to tour the Plant during the Anniversary Celebration won't be available until May 15th and tours are \$50. There will also be wine and whiskey tastings, some form of Casino activity, and many, many displays by manufacturers of after market Corvette products.

While there are some significant costs associated with attending the 30th NCM Anniversary Celebration, it's also a 'Super Bowl" level showcase for Corvettes and all things associated with Corvettes. We'll be attempting to answer questions for those who have never attended but we very much encourage you to be checking this out early so you can make your decision soon enough to avoid being shutout of many activities.



Member's Chat - A Corvette Story

An April Birthday member! - Ken has a 2023 C8 coupe.

Here is Ken's story to share:

I was going to "build" from a sheet that I had prepared, and walked into the dealer, with the idea that I was going to order and wait then typical 12 months, or so, for it to arrive. I was informed that the dealer had met their allocation and was unable to place Corvette orders at that time. about to walk, and the salesperson informed me that they had just received a new Vette the day before, and it was not yet sold, would I be interested, to which I responded that I was not. He questioned why, and I told him that all dealers were currently asking upwards to \$20,000 over MSRP for Vetts on the lot, and I said I am not participating in that game. Surprisingly, he responded that he would sell it for MSRP, so I looked at it, and found it much to my liking, and it had many of the extras that I wanted and had listed on my "build sheet". After a few minutes of haggling over some details of interest to me, I finally said "done deal", and picked it up, and paid for it the next afternoon.

<u>Do you have a special name for your corvette?</u> No, Just Ken's c8 I ordered custom license plates with that lettering.

<u>Color</u> – The color is Hypersonic Grey Metallic, I was not overly thrilled about the color, but it has grown on me, and I have received loads of compliments on the color, so it must be well liked by the masses.

<u>Looks</u> – I love the appearance, and have since done some engine compartment enhancements, as well as insulation against heat, in the rear storage compartment.

<u>Have you Tried other cars?</u> I have indeed tried other cars, but never to replace a Corvette, only to have my other car.

Share a tip with the group that you have found interesting about the Corvette. The first thing that I did was to purchase a sheet of heat shield from TEMU, and I removed the rear storage preformed carpet, by removing the Targa top storage clips and set the storage compartment aside. This gave access to a removeable cover with (18) t-15 screws, I unscrewed them and exposed the air cleaner area. I then used scissors to cut fitting pieces, and applied them (selfsticking on the insulation side, and foil heat shield on the opposing surface) to the side of the cover that faces the engine, and then I simply reattached the cover with the 18 screws. I had material left over, so I also covered the other side of the cover, giving a two-layer heat shield. Then I returned the preformed storage compartment and reinstalled the targa top clips. The resulting heat reduction in the rear storage compartment has been reduced by an average of about 27 degrees f., as checked by my touchless thermometer gun. I also removed my engine cover, and the two steel braces above the engine, and painted them, and the mounting bolts, a red that is a good match to the "torch red". I used heat resistant primer (two coats), Heat resistant red paint for plastic (two coats), and a heat resistant clear coat, (two coats). Before I painted, I lightly sanded all, washed it with soap and water and a brush, and after they were dry, I wiped everything with alcohol.

I taped off the metal applications on the engine cover, and I bought some tiny artist brushes, and painted all of the insignia with proper colors in small artist bottles that I found at Hobby Lobby. The total cost for the insulation installation was about \$14.00 and took about 1 ¼ hours. The painting had a total cost of about \$30.00, and took about a week, due to drying times between coats, but was simple and well worth the effort, it turned out great, and about \$675.00 less than if I had it done by Corvette.

4 Days of Racing Culminating in the 12 Hours of Sebring Member Article submitted by Dan Whidden

Patti and I grew up in central Florida and one of the things I never did and always wanted to do was attend the 12 Hours of Sebring race. We decided that this year was the year to go. I purchased 4-day tickets to the Corvette Corral and booked a hotel in my old hometown of Winter Haven Fl. It's about an hour and a half drive away from the racecourse. We were able to visit our favorite restaurants such as the Columbia in Ybor City. Always a highlight for us when we are in the area.

The Corvette corral provides a tent, tables, chairs, private grandstands, and parking located on turn 17. On 3 of the 4 days, they provide a light breakfast, snacks, lunch on the day 4 and air-conditioned restrooms were a bonus since it reached 90 deg on several of the days. We participated in Parade Laps on the race-course (much faster than your average parade!!!) Everything they say about the racetrack being rough and bumpy is true! There were guest speakers, autograph sessions by the drivers (both PrattMiller Motorsports and AWA Racing). Speakers included Doug Fehan (Corvette Racing Ambassador and former Corvette Racing Program Manager), Laura Klauser (Chevrolet Racing Program Manager), Ron Fellows (Corvettes most winning Race Driver and Ambassador), Tadge Juncter (Executive Chief Engineer Corvette), Josh Holder (Chief Corvette Engineer), Ed Moss (Corvette Body Engineer) and a Mobile 1 presenter. There was a question-and-answer session after each talk. I also was able to speak individually with each speaker. There were raffles and auctions benefiting the Austin Hatcher Foundation. Patti aggressively bid on a set of Michelin Tires and won!

We visited the paddock area and watched as the cars returned after IMSA inspection. They then began a tear down of the cars. They had a Gold livery to celebrate Mobile 1s 50th anniversary. This is the only time they will race in gold.

In the paddock area we also saw some fans who celebrate the event in very unique ways.






The race: All 4 Corvettes went to the back at starting due to a penalty. A modification to reinforce the rear diffuser was not disclosed during inspection.

Excerpts from a press release gives the details of the race.

Press Release: CORVETTE RACING AT SEBRING:

AWA Leads Corvette Contingent at Finish

SEBRING, Fla. (March 16, 2024) – The No. 13 AWA Chevrolet Corvette Z06 GT3.R led the contingent of first-year GT3 Corvettes at the end of Saturday's Mobil 1 Twelve Hours of Sebring presented by Cadillac. The trio of Orey Fidani, Matt Bell and Lars Kern placed ninth in a 22-car GT Daytona (GTD) field at Sebring International Raceway in the second round of the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship.

The No. 3 Oshkosh/Mobil 1 Corvette Z06 GT3.R of Antonio Garcia, Alexander Sims and Daniel Juncadella looked as if it would take the honors as the highest-finishing Corvette in the race before being hit from behind and spun off track in the waning laps while running second in GTD PRO. The No, 3 finished 10th in GTD PRO..

Late-race chaos saw Juncadella jostled around by multiple cars, the final being the impact that knocked the No. 3 Corvette off the circuit with six minutes to go.

The No. 4 Corvette Racing by Pratt Miller Motorsports Z06 GT3.R lost time in the first half of the race trying to sort clutch issues while trying to remain in GTD PRO contention with servicing during pit stops. Near the halfway point, the team elected to change a clutch component and lost multiple laps in the process.

AWA's second Corvette - the No. 17 Z06 GT3.R in GTD – retired early in the race with an electrical problem.

The next IMSA round for the Corvette Z06 GT3.R program is the Acura Grand Prix of Long Beach – featuring the GTD class – on April 20 from the Long Beach (Calif.) Street Circuit.

How to OD a Cruise

Be sure to drive your route prior to planning your event. Avoid highways where possible and strive to provide a relaxing, enjoyable ride.

Make sure you receive the sign-up sheets from the Club Events Coordinator. It's important that you know how many are attending and you can make contact with members in the event there is a cancellation or change in plans.

Just prior to departure, always call a driver's meeting to discuss the route and garner questions if any, from those in attendance. If your event is heavily attended, assign a secondary leader and split your group into 2 convoys.

- If your event has 10 or more Corvettes, it is helpful to hand out maps or directions just in case some members get separated from the group or get caught in traffic.
- Always provide a cell phone number where you can be reached in case of an emergency, a breakdown or if someone has need to restroom break.
- Get club radios from the Events Coordinator and distribute them to members who need them. It is helpful to place members with club radios throughout the caravan to relay messages in the event those at the rear are out of radio range.
- Make sure you and the last car in the convoy have a radio. This is helpful to let you know when all the cars have cleared a traffic light or intersection.
- Maintain a consistent and sensible speed. Do NOT be responsible for your group getting multiple speeding tickets. (Yes, it can happen!) It also minimizes the effects of "rubber banding" within the pack.
- When approaching traffic lights with multiple thru lanes, encourage members fills all lanes when stopped. This allows more cars to clear the intersection on the green and keeps your convoy intact.
- Do not allow cars to get strung out, where members at the rear have speed to catch up. Encourage members to maintain a safe distance, but stay together.
- When possible, stay out of the passing lane. This allows other vehicles to pass your convoy without interrupting your grouping.
- Remember, you are not alone. When passing other vehicles, be sure to allow enough room for those behind you to safely make the pass. Never weave in and out of traffic.
- Have fun! Remember that hosting an event is a great way to make new friends and share places of interest
