Revs & Rumbles @ the NCM

November is upon us, it's the last quarter of the year, and Father Time is prepping to show us what 2024 is gonna be about. But...now we are already being shown a major preview of what '24 is going to mean for Corvette innovation as we witness the brand's latest foray into the future.



Love it and/or hate it, a new sheriff is in town and the Corvette Faithful will be pulled in more directions than ever with this one. For starters, the E-Ray shares the same wide-body and frontend as the high performing Z06. Following that similarity with a difference, the E-Ray is the first Corvette to be outfitted with AWD. A second variation from all vettes that have preceded it is that it's propulsion is of the non-plug-in hybrid variety. The front axle is powered by an electric motor contributing 160 hp while the rear axle is rotated by a 6.2 L V-8 (used in the Stingray Z51) providing 495 hp which combine to offer 655 hp. That output has allowed the E-Ray to hit 60 mph in only 2.5 seconds. Note: that's 0.1 sec faster than the Z06 coupe delivering 670 hp and hitting 60 mph in 2.6 seconds.

Gas mileage appears to approximate the Stingray's, at about 19 mpg. The hybrid system provides extra power for acceleration and then recharges whenever the Corvette is coasting, braking, or using the Charge + function on the move. The dual-clutch transmission remains standard.

Some of the numbers of interest have already been presented and center around the E-Ray's performance: 0-60 in 2.5 sec, quarter-mile in 10.5 sec, 655 combined hp. The AWD is a form of e-AWD and Magnetic Selective Ride Control is standard on all of these electrified versions. There is also a feature dubbed 'stealth mode' wherein the car may be driven 3-4 miles at speeds up to 45 mph using the electric motor propulsion only and thereby allowing a driver to exit his neighborhood quietly if he/she is so inclined. Additionally, carbon ceramic brakes and all-season tires are standard, as is the aforementioned 8-speed automatic transmission and a 12-inch diagonal Reconfigurable Digital Instrument Display. New is a Driver Mode Selector standard on all trim levels which allows choices from preset Weather, Tour, Sport, and Track Modes as well as a customizable MyMode. Finally, there is a Z Mode which allows the driver to personalize almost every aspect of the driving experience.

Now to the final 'shocker' (remember this is about electrification), which presents *starting* costs for the E-Ray:

- 1LZ Coupe starts @ \$104,900
- 2LZ Coupe starts @ \$110,400
- 3LZ Coupe starts @ \$115,850
- 1LZ Convertible starts @ \$111,900
- 2LZ Convertible starts @ \$117,400
- 3LZ Convertible starts @ \$122,850

Note: the 2024 Corvette Stingray (no electric or hybrid) starts @ \$68,300.

Karen and I will drive to the National Corvette Museum in Bowling Green, KY, on Nov 8th and return on the 11th after attending the annual Ambassador Convention to learn about all things new and forthcoming. We'll wish everyone a joyous Thanksgiving and hope to see you at the Christmas Party!

Corvette Club of Richmond completed its annual fall migration to Tim's at Lake Anna restaurant. A substantial amount of seafood was consumed!




